Ontario Community Food Center


The Ontario Community Food Center, opening in late 2026, aims to create an accessible and welcoming food-centered space that will cultivate fundamental changes to the food system in the Western Treasure Valley. The Center seeks to improve the quality of life and economic opportunities throughout the community. It will be a space where food-based business ideas will spark, existing businesses will grow and the unique agricultural culture of Ontario and the Western Treasure Valley will be celebrated.



The community food center will be nestled between Valley Family Health Care and River Bend Place, an affordable housing community. Located on a campus in one of Ontario's most under-resourced neighborhoods, The Center will be one of several wrap-around services, lowering barriers to food, healthcare, housing, and more for our most vulnerable community members.












